Types of Relationships



- *REACTIVE* □ Check resources & provide the answer
- INVITATIONAL Ask about other books he has read and enjoyed
 - *SUGGESTIVE* □ Suggest some other titles he might like
- **ENLIGHTENING** Show the resources you used (or other resources)
- ANTICIPATORY Suggest he sign up for your fantasy e-newsletter
- *CONTRIBUTORY* □ Encourage him to rate or review in the catalog
- PARTICIPATORY Ask if he is interested in a fantasy book club
