Language Revitalization Programs

Programs tend to fall in 1 of 5 categories:

- 1. school-based programs
- 2. children's programs (outside of school)
- 3. adult programs
- 4. documentation & material development
- 5. home-based programs

Language Revitalization Initiatives:

- 1. Mother-Tongue a child's 1st language
- 2. Language Nests 1st language acquisition, living the language, daily
- 3. Master/Apprentice adult 2nd language acquisition, living the language, daily
- 4. Elementary Classroom full immersion in primary, daily culturally-based, experiential
- 5. Adult Classroom full immersion, daily, long-term, culturally-based, experiential
- 6. Language-as-a-Subject elementary, secondary, post-secondary
 - vocabulary-based, grammatical
- 7. Night Course/Day Course short term, adult, vocabulary, grammar
- 8. Language Camps short term, week-long, weekends
 - cultural, partial immersion, any age/mixed ages/family
- 9. On-line courses short term, mixed
- 10. Labling, Signage, Billboards, Radio, TV, newsletters
