What is an Outcome?

An outcome is a **specific benefit**, derived by a user, that results from using a library program or service. Benefits to a user as measured by a change in their knowledge, skills, attitudes, behavior, condition or status.

What is an Outcome?

Outcomes can be expressed as changes that individuals perceive in themselves.

What is an Outcome?

User <u>outcomes</u> can be <u>quantitative</u> and <u>qualitative</u>.





Descriptive statistics such as Inputs and Outputs are NOT <u>outcomes</u>.

For the purposes of our definition please don't confuse internal library "outcomes" (meeting goals/objectives) ... these are NOT user <u>outcomes</u>.







Efficiency VS Effectiveness

- Traditional Library Statistics are descriptive
 - provide context
 - In combination can measure <u>efficiency</u>
- Outcomes are about <u>effectiveness</u>
 - User outcomes which more broadly and cumulatively result in community impacts
 - Combined with traditional statistics demonstrate competence and augment advocacy efforts

Simple and Effective Measurement

Exit Survey

Immediately upon consumption of a service

Follow-up

Ideally timed by and about user specific outcomes

Community Partner/Data

Cohort comparisons (relative rankings)



Overview: Project Outcome Timeline

- July 2013: Performance Measurement Task Force (PMTF) initiated
- June 2015: Project Outcome launched
 - Funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
 - Builds resources and support around PMTF work
- Spring 2016: PMTF to release advanced measures
- Post-Grant (2018): PLA management of Project
 Outcome continues





Measuring Outcomes: Survey Development

Performance Measurement Task Force

- Initiated: July 2013
- Membership: public libraries, state libraries, and assessment researchers
- Charge:
 - Develop standardized outcome measures for widelyoffered public library services & programs
 - Promote the training for implementation and use of the measures across public libraries



- Survey design
 - simple and short
 - o easy to administer
- Task Force members continue to develop new, advanced measures

Measuring Outcomes: Early Childhood Literacy

Multiple choice questions measure:

- Learned something new
- Increased confidence
- Anticipated change in behavior
- Increased awareness

Measuring Outcomes: Early Childhood Literacy

Open-ended questions measure:

- General patron feedback
- Suggestions for improvement

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
