




FEASIBILITY STUDY



- Feasibility study started in 2013
- Looked into current service model
- Recommended changes aiming at business efficiencies

TRANSFORM ADDITIONAL SPACE TO PUBLIC AREA




Rationale

- Opened in 1991 and population has more than doubled since built
- Downtown core population
 - Young Adults (age 20-39) make up 43% of the DT Core compared to 27% of the City total
 - 2%-6% increase in student age segments (age 17-27) in past 5 years, within
 3km radius of Central Library
 - Increase of 5,500 Sheridan college students since 2011 which has resulted in demand for study space
- 31% Future Directions survey respondents identify Central Library as the library they go to most often (Forum Research)
- Majority of floor plans dedicated to stacks & containment of material

TRENDS

INCREASED DEMAND PUTS PRESSURE ON LIBRARY SPACE



- Ideal program space 600 1,000 sq. feet
 - Allows for multiple layout options
- Average computer work station requires 40-50 sq. ft. versus 25-30 sq. ft.
 for seating area traditionally provided and still required
 - The popularity and space requirements of a desktop computer put pressure on the Library footprint
 - MLS exploring tablets; laptops in addition to desktops
- Digital Literacy programs at full capacity
 - Currently Makerspaces being constructed within existing footprint of the library
 - Takes away from other uses (Eg. Study room, Collection space)

TRENDS

THE LIBRARY IS BELOW COMPARATORS & INDUSTRY STANDARDS FOR **SPACE PER SQUARE FOOTAGE**

- Square footage of library space per capita is the industry standard measurement for the level of service delivery within a geographic area
- MLS is at 0.46 provision level, which is below the 0.55 average of its comparators
- The industry standard target is 0.6

Opportunity

- Move from resource-driven to customer-focused
- Redevelopment 2019-2020
- Capture of additional 20,000 sq. ft. (in scope)
- Prospect for further 8,000 sq. ft. (4th floor)
 - Expand fourth floor by converting space from non-library uses
 - \$2.5M eligible to be covered through DC
 - In order to create more space for digital hub and children's programming, study & quiet space were reduced on the second and third floors. The fourth floor expansion will be dedicated primarily to public study space

- 2016 budget approval to renovate facility

Expanding on this substantial base, *Downtown21* is designed to promote the continued evolution of a livable, compact, accessible, sustainable downtown centre for the entire city which will enhance Mississauga's competitive advantage and reputation as a forward looking community.












Early Concepts – Mississauga Central Library Renovation




